



Edward Johnston Jr. Murder Still Unsolved Two-Year Anniversary **\$1,000 Reward**

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and the San Diego Police Department's Homicide Unit continue to look for leads in the unsolved murder of Edward Johnston Jr. December 9, 2010 marks the two-year anniversary of his death.

On December 9, 2008, at 7:35 p.m., officers responded to a report of gunshots heard on the 900 block of Cardiff Street in the Jamacha-Lomita neighborhood. Police arrived at the scene to find two shooting victims in the parking lot of a strip mall. Paramedics transported both victims to a trauma center. Eighteen-year-old Edward Johnston Jr. was pronounced dead at 8:30 p.m. His companion, a 17-year-old male, underwent surgery, but survived his injuries.

The suspect, who was armed with a handgun, initially made a robbery demand, then issued a gang challenge before shooting both victims. He was described as an 18-20 year old Hispanic male.

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and the San Diego Police Department are asking for the public's assistance to identify and locate the person responsible for this murder. There is a reward of up to \$51,000 for information on the case. Crime Stoppers is offering a reward of up to \$1,000 and the Office of the Governor is offering a reward of up to \$50,000. The Crime Stoppers reward is paid upon arrest, the Governor's reward is paid on arrest and conviction.

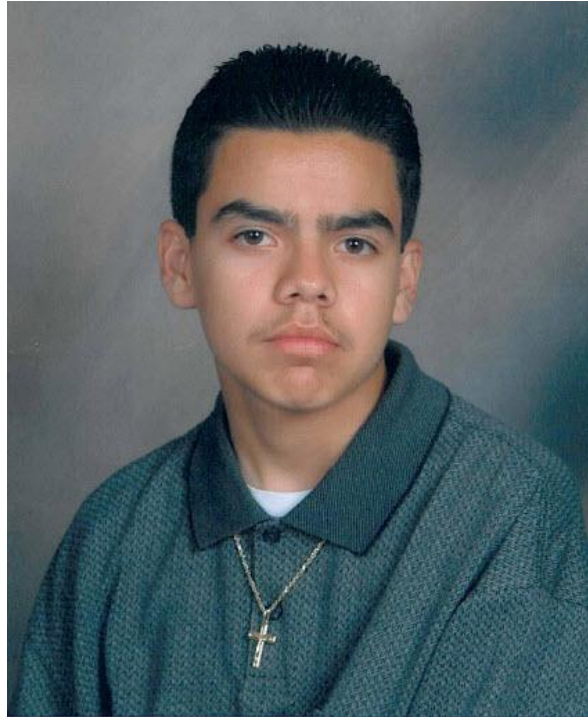
