



Parolee Sought for Vista Assault and Indecent Exposure; Up to \$1,000 Reward Offered

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and investigators from the San Diego County Sheriff's Department Vista station are asking for assistance from the public in identifying a parolee wanted for assault and indecent exposure.

On September 12, 2010, Andres Hernandez Camarena was driving on the 400 block of Massachusetts Avenue in Vista when he contacted two teenage females who were walking together. He told the girls that he was lost and asked them for directions while masturbating. One of the girls used her cellular telephone to photograph the rear license plate of his vehicle. Hernandez put the vehicle in reverse and accelerated rapidly towards the girl in an apparent attempt to run her over. Both girls were unharmed.

Andres Hernandez Camarena was paroled from state prison on September 11, 2010. He knows he is wanted and has removed his GPS device. His original commitment offense was 261(a)(2) PC – rape.

Investigators are asking anyone with information on the location of Andres Hernandez Camarena to call the **Crime Stoppers anonymous tip line at (888) 580-8477**. Crime Stoppers is offering up to a \$1,000 reward to anyone with information that leads to an arrest in this case.
